

NOTICE OF CITIZENS INFORMATIONAL WORKSHOPS FOR THE INTERSTATE 95 (I-95) CORRIDOR PLANNING AND FINANCE STUDY

The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) will hold a series of seven (7) public meetings, known as Citizens Informational Workshops, for the above mentioned highway study. NCDOT representatives will be available in an informal setting to answer questions and receive comments relative to the proposed study. The opportunity to submit written comments or questions will also be provided.
